Total bankruptcy filings nationwide topped 7,000 cases last week for the sixth consecutive week. Chapter 7 filings continue to be down sharply from 2021 and 2020 (the first two years of the pandemic), while chapter 13 filings have gone up over the last two years. However, filings of chapters 7, 11 and 13 are all down substantially from the same period in 2019 (pre-pandemic).














Chapter 11 Filing Trends Percent Change From 2021 and 2020





Chapter 11 Cases

Chapter 11 filings last week were well below the filing totals for same week for each of the last three years. (The figures for 2020 were skewed by the Quorum Health Corp. case, which included 134 related filings.) Chapter 11 filings in 2022 are on pace to be the lowest ever since the Bankruptcy Code became effective in 1979.

Other than the Legacy Lifestyles chapter 15 proceedings mentioned above, there were no particularly large or notable cases filed during the week.
