


Total bankruptcy filings last week were down sharply from the same week last year. Two factors contributed to decrease being larger than normal. The 2022 President's Day Holiday was celebrated last Monday, while it was observed during the prior week during 2021. Also, filings always spike on the last day of the month, and February 26 was the last business day of the month in 2021. However, filings of all types were down by more than half during the week compared to two years ago (just before the onset of the pandemic).




The following charts show recent weekly filing trends by chapter compared to 2021 and 2020.

Chapter 11 Cases

Chapter 11 filings during the week were well under the number filed during the same week each of the last two years. In particular, chapter 11 filings by individuals have been much

lower than in prior years. Additionally, there were no particularly large or notable chapter 11 cases filed during the week.
