

The 7,271 bankruptcy cases filed last week were well above the number of filings during the same week each of the last two years, and just a little below filings during the last week of 2020.


The official filing numbers for 2023 will not be released by the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts for another month or so, but a preliminary count shows that about 454,000 cases were filed during the year — a 17 percent increase from 2022.



## **Chapter 11 Cases**

The 75 chapter 11 cases filed last week were a little below typical recent weekly filing levels. However, filings of all types are generally fairly low around the end of December.

For the year, around 7,350 chapter 11 cases were filed — about a 50 percent increase over filings in 2022.

The single large or notable chapter 11 filing during the week was made by the Franciscan Friars of California, Inc., which filed in the Northern District of California on December 31. This was the 37th chapter 11 case filed as a result of clergy abuse, and the seventh such case filed in 2023. The filings involve eight archdioceses, 25 dioceses and four religious orders. (An archdiocese is generally larger than a diocese and is headed by an archbishop.)
