
The 5,860 bankruptcy cases filed last week was the third-lowest weekly total for the year, mainly due to the Thanksgiving holiday.


The following chart shows filings by day during the week. Filings during Thanksgiving week are always quite low, because very few cases are filed on Thanksgiving or the following Friday.



Chapter 11 Cases

There were only 40 chapter 11 cases filed last week, the lowest weekly total in almost two years. However, chapter 11 filings in 2023 are up by over 60 percent compared to the same period in 2022.

For the first time in five months, there were no particularly large or notable chapter 11 cases filed during the week (*i.e.*, cases with debtors who report more than \$100 million in assets or liabilities, or cases that are of interest beyond a local area). However, so far in 2023 there have been 133 such cases filed, more than double the amount filed in all of 2022.
