


The 10,361 bankruptcy cases filed last week were well above the number of filings during the same week during each of the last two years. However, bankruptcy filings remain well below pre-pandemic levels.


The following charts show recent weekly filing trends by chapter compared to the same week during the last four years.

Chapter 11 Cases

There were 153 chapter 11 cases filed during the week. Nearly half of these cases were by small business debtors who opted to proceed under subchapter V. Total chapter 11 filings for the week were above the number of filings during the same week the last two years. (A majority of the filings during this week in 2020 were related filings in the cases filed by shopping mall owners Pennsylvania Real Estate Investment Trust and CBL Associates Properties Inc.)
