


The 7,984 bankruptcy cases filed last week were somewhat above weekly filings during the same week in 2022 and 2021. However, bankruptcy filings remain well below pre-pandemic levels.

Chapter 11 Cases

There were 109 chapter 11 cases filed during the week. Chapter 11 filings in 2023 are up by about 50 percent compared to 2022, with nearly half of all cases being filed in Delaware, New York or Texas.
